# Current State of the RES Form in POWER

- New Rotation and Educational Site Effectiveness (RESE) report piloted in 36 RCPSC Programs and 18 FM Programs for 2014/15
- 8% avg. increase in RE completions from previous year for programs in pilot.
- Overall and mean score distributions have trended to the left of the 5 point scale (fewer 5's and more 4's)

# RESE Form

- 6 questions plus an overall question
- Questions probe themes of:
  - Organization of Rotation
  - Educational Design
  - Learning Supports
  - Learning Climate
  - Educational Experience
  - Facilities at site
- Emphasis on comments for each question and ranking of strengths/weaknesses

# Proposed RES Report Comparisons

- Filter for

- Residents       Fellows       Residents and Fellows
- Internal Learners       External Learners       Internal and External
- Flag internal versus external rotations

- Suggested comparisons:

- Rotation and Site (N): Mean score for same rotation at the same teaching location within this program.
- Rotation All Sites (N): Mean score for same rotation at all other teaching locations within this program.
- All Rotations at this Site (N): Mean score for all rotations at the same teaching location within this program.

- Teaching Location(s)- Includes evaluations for *all* teacher, at the *same*, location(s) in this Residency Program, for the *same* rotation(s), using this form.
- All Teaching Locations- Includes evaluation for the *same* rotation(s), for *all* teachers, at *all* locations, in this Residency Program, using this form.
