

# TUBERCULOSIS (TB) TESTING REQUIREMENTS

## NEW POSTGRADUATE LEARNERS

All new postgraduate learners must meet TB testing requirements before their training start date.

### If you have a Negative TB Test History



Use the table below to identify your situation and the documentation you are required to provide.

TB Testing History	What you need to Provide
You completed a two-step Mantoux test within the past 12 months of your training start date	Provide your recent two-step Mantoux test results
You completed a two-step Mantoux test more than 12 months before your training start date	Provided the results of your previous two-step Mantoux test (completed more than 12 months ago) & one of the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• one-step Mantoux test or</li> <li>• an IGRA test (both must be within 1 year of your start date)</li> </ul>
You have never completed a two -step Mantoux test	Complete a full two-step Mantoux test (see Two-Step Mantoux Test Process below).

### TWO - STEP MANTOUX TEST PROCESS

Skin Test	What happens?	Reading of Results
1 <sup>st</sup> Skin Test	Implantation of the Tuberculin Skin Test (TST)	48-72 hours after implantation
Learners must wait at least 7 days after the 1 <sup>st</sup> skin test before completing a 2 <sup>nd</sup> skin test		
2 <sup>nd</sup> Skin Test	Impantation of the Tuberculin Skin Test (TST)	48-72 hours after implantation

### If you have a Positive TB Test History



You **DO NOT** need a 2-Step Mantoux Test

### REQUIRED DOCUMENTS TO SUBMIT :

- Positive TB Test Result
- Chest x-Ray Report
- Report from provider or clinic that you have been assessed or treated for active or latent tuberculosis

**BCG vaccination is not a contraindication for Tuberculosis Skin Test (TST).**  
**A chest X-ray alone is not accepted as a substitute for the TST**
