Dear Residency and Fellowship Program Directors, and FM Site Directors,

In these unprecedented times, we thank you for the contribution you and your colleagues, staff and trainees are making to our healthcare system.

Last week we provided information on the potential redeployment of residents and clinical fellows. At this time, we are providing you with the attached templates and documents to aid you in this redeployment.

The attached procedural companion document has been reviewed by our HUEC members and serves as a guide to match demand with available providers.

All scheduling should be reflected in POWER, and PGME staff are able to assist if required. In addition, we are requesting that you complete the attached template to reflect the details of the redeployment for each trainee. Our office can work with you and/or your coordinator(s) to ensure the information is complete.

We are also asking that you advise us of any individual or group of trainees who are underutilized within a site or service and are available for redeployment due to suspended activities (e.g. ambulatory environments). It is particularly important that we have this information to assist sites and services in need of extra help.
