UHN Postgraduate Medical Education

- Enhancing and maintaining the environment and facilities for learners (e.g. call rooms, learners lounges, education centres, lockers, lactation rooms, wellness centres and gyms, discounted staff parking...etc)
- **Registration** of learners and ensuring that all residents and fellows have access to critical functions to work and learn at UHN (e.g. UMLearns, ID badges, EPIC access etc)
- Support educational leadership and learners:
 - good times (e.g. accomplishments and awards such as the Mack Bursary for junior residents),
 - bad times (e.g. professionalism or privacy breaches whilst working at UHN, patient relations or CPSO complaints)
