# PGME Expansion Goal

- Establish Scarborough Health Network (SHN) and Trillium Health Partners (THP) as base hospital sites with increased presence of PG learners and, eventually, specialty CaRMS streams. Secondary focus on Barrie/Orillia/Midland corridor.
- Note: the 27 specialty expansion PGY1s may be re-assigned to PG programs that are able to achieve this goal.



# PGME Expansion Funding - Purpose

Funds must be used to support the cost of building PG capacity at THP and SHN:

- Department/Program expansion lead and administrative support
- Site Director and administrator
- Site curriculum and other costs

Expansion funding must be spent by March 31<sup>st</sup> of the fiscal year it is allocated.

Expansion funding cannot be used for capital project expenses or non-physician training expenses.

PGME will support:

- CFD Teaching & Learning in the Clinical Context (TLC) for Scarborough faculty
- CFD New and Evolving Academic Leaders (NEAL)



# Departmental Expansion Plans

- Commitment to increasing resident rotations at SHN and THP starting in 2025-26 or earlier.
- Commitment to developing a CaRMS-entry stream or equivalent at SHN and THP starting in 2025-26 or later.
- Plan outline requested to include:
  - Proposed use of funds.
  - Details re: number of residents/rotations/level/curriculum delivery.
  - Names of RPC representatives from SHN and THP (if available).



# TMU – Status Update

- Planning an intake of 105 PGYs in 2025 in FM, Anesthesia, Emergency Medicine, Internal Medicine (core), Geriatrics, General Surgery, General Internal Medicine, Obstetrics and Gynecology, Psychiatry, Pediatrics, and Surgical Foundations.
- Recently recognized as an accredited institution by CanRAC
- Discussions with Interim PG Dean Brent Thoma re:
  - Specific rotations required to support RC Programs via IIAAs
  - Potential collaborations on AHDs – likely to occur via Agreement/MOU with reference to resources and responsibility of U of T programs to support AHD activity
